Introduction to MUN

Model United Nations simulates UN forums where delegates discuss global issues and draft resolutions.

Essential Rules

- English is the official language, with exceptions for Arabic Committees.
- Plagiarism will result in a resolution's automatic failure.
- Dress Code
1st day – Semi-Formal.
2nd & 3rd days – Formal.

Points

- **Point of Personal Privilege:** Address personal discomforts (e.g., room's temperature).
- **Point of Information:** Ask clarifying questions about the topic being discussed.
- **Right to Reply & Request for Follow-Up:** Address direct mentions or ask further questions.

Motions

- **Motion to Move into Voting Procedure:** Progress to vote on a topic or resolution.
- **Motion to Extend Debate Time:** Increase allocated discussion time.
- **Motion for an Open Debate:** Engage in a debate without a speaker list.
